# Prevent Web Sites from Accessing Your Local Clipboard

- If your security level isn't set to High and you still wish to prevent IE's dynamic HTML from accessing your Web site, you should disable the "Allow paste operations via script" option.
- If the security level for your Internet zones (Tools, Internet Options, Security) in Internet Explorer 5.0 or later is set to High, you're already preventing Web sites from accessing your local clipboard.

# Prevent Web Sites from Accessing Your Local Clipboard

- Start Internet Explorer.
- Go to Tools, Internet Options and click on the Security tab.
- Select the Internet zone and click Custom Level.
- Under the Scripting section, configure the "Allow paste operations via script" option to Disable and then click OK.
- In IE 7.0, the option is called "Allow Programmatic clipboard access."

# How to Open .MDI Files in Windows Vista

- You try to read a document with .MDI extension but get an error
- MDI stands for Microsoft Document Imaging
- Office 2003 installs a printer called Microsoft Office Document Image Writer
- Printing to this virtual printer creates a file with .MDI extension
- MDI format is Microsoft's proprietary file format that's useful for storing raster images of scanned files



# How to Open .MDI Files in Windows Vista

- By default, Office 2007 setup doesn't install Microsoft Office Document Image Writer so you can't read .MDI files

## **Solution 1:**

Drag and drop the .MDI file into OneNote

## **Solution 2:**

Install Microsoft Office Document Image Writer



# How to Open .MDI Files in Windows Vista

## **Solution 2:**

1. Go to Control Panel in Windows
2. Under Programs, click Uninstall
3. Highlight your Office 2007 version Microsoft Office Ultimate 2007).
4. Click Change near the top of the
5. By default, Add or Remove Features is highlighted. Click Continue.



# How to Open .MDI Files in Windows Vista

6. Go to the Office Tools section and highlight Microsoft Office Document Imaging
7. From the drop-down box, select Run All from My Computer and click Continue
8. Click Close when finished
9. You'll see a new virtual printer called Microsoft Office Document Image Writer and you'll be able to open .MDI files

# Unexpected Login Prompts in Outlook Anywhere

- If you are running Exchange Server 2007 and Outlook 2007 clients, users may get login prompts when they've been configured to use NTLM authentication
- You need to modify Outlook Anywhere settings for the *Autodiscover* service to solve this issue
- Go to the server that's running the Client Access server role

# Unexpected Login Prompts in Outlook Anywhere

- Logon to the server with an account that has the Exchange Organization Administrator role
- Start the Exchange Management Shell and run the following command:

**Set-OutlookProviderEXPR -Server \$null**

- Restart Internet Information Services (IIS) or recycle *MSExchangeAutodiscoverAppPool* on the Exchange Server that's running the Client Access server role

# Unexpected Login Prompts in Outlook Anywhere

- Restarting IIS is simple but if you decide to recycle *MSExchangeAutodiscoverAppPool*, you need to go to Application Pools container in the IIS console
- Right-click *MSExchangeAutodiscoverAppPool* and select Recycle
- You won't expect any messages confirming your action but the application pool will get recycled
- If you have any doubts then restart IIS rather than recycling the Application Pool
